Color Poem Activity

What is a color poem?

If you had to put your favorite color into words, what would you say about it? How would you describe it? A color poem forces you to think about color in a descriptive way, using your senses.

Directions:

- 1. Choose a color it does not have to be your favorite!
- 2. Brainstorm descriptive words about your color using your five senses. Questions you could consider:
 - a. What looks like my color?
 - b. What sounds like my color?
 - c. What smells like my color?
 - d. What feels like my color?
 - e. What makes me feel like my color?
 - f. What tastes like my color?
 - g. What experiences/ideas are like my color?
 - h. What places are my color?
- 3. Color it!

Remember!

This is **not** literal. This is asking you to think about comparing your color to words we do not usually associate with it. Think outside the box and have some fun!
